FOREWORD

"President Putin's war of aggression on Ukraine has shattered peace in Europe and shaken the entire international order. It is not just an unprovoked and unjustified attack on a sovereign, independent nation. It is an attack on the whole system of global rules on which our peace and prosperity depend."The words of Jens Stoltenberg, Secretary General of NATO, in the fourth issue of *Atlantisch Perspectief* in 2022 speak volumes. This year was all about the war in Ukraine in every way, including for the Netherlands Atlantic Association.

The year 2022 was also a year in which the consequences of the corona crisis remained palpable. Fewer events were held, and some were still online or hybrid, for example, some of the events organized by Netherlands Atlantic Youth, such as the Book Club on January 20 and a meeting on February 8 about Japan and its defense policy. Fortunately, the Netherlands Atlantic Youth were able to hold a very well-attended program about the Russian invasion of Ukraine on March 8 in the Academiegebouw of Utrecht University. In front of a room of 175 students and young professionals, Laurien Crump and Tony van der Togt discussed the new reality that has descended on the European continent: the first war on European territory between states in a long time. The online/hybrid format also paid off for a February 18 meeting of the Netherlands Atlantic Association on US foreign policy, with 251 participants.

The StudiumGenerale program, which is intended to provide talented young professionals a look behind the scenes within the Netherlands Atlantic Association's extensive network of ministries, multinationals and NGOs, also faced limitations in 2022. The corona measures at the beginning of the year had a major impact on the course of this program. However, the participants were able to visit the American Embassy on February 25, there was a program about the US midterm elections with Matt Mayer in Nieuwspoort just before the summer, and a discussion program about geopolitical developments with Alex Krijger could also take place.

Interest in Atlantisch Perspectief remained high in 2022. This has also led to further external cooperation. For example, the share of authors, and potential authors, outside the Netherlands and the US has increased, including prominent writers from Germany, Portugal, Spain, Turkey, Hong Kong and Japan. The cooperation of NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg has almost become a matter of course. Also in 2022, he wrote a foreword for a NATO special issue, this time about the alliance's new Strategic Concept.

All the articles from *Atlantisch Perspectief* and its predecessors are now accessible online. Relevant publications (dating from the 1960s to the present) can be consulted on the American database JSTOR (an American digital library with digitized books and other primary sources, as well as current issues of periodicals). This means that *Atlantisch Perspectief* can be consulted free of charge by a worldwide audience of students and

academics. It should also be mentioned that the issue about Germany, which had to be updated and adjusted at the last minute due to developments in the Russian invasion of Ukraine, received many positive reactions from the Netherlands Atlantic Association's broad network.

Responding to changes is something the Netherlands Atlantic Association has proven to be very good at. The same goes for reaching a younger audience. It is becoming increasingly successful in serving students and young professionals, and the Netherlands Atlantic Youth deserve all the credit for this. Once again, the NATO Night, organized by Netherlands Atlantic Youth, was a great success. Prominent speakers such as Marisa Gerards, Bob Deen, Han Bouwmeester and Hester Somsen took up the challenge during the evening, which was appropriately named Challenge Accepted. They talked to almost four hundred students and young professionals during this hybrid meeting in De Balie in Amsterdam.

The Netherlands Atlantic has come through 2022 in splendid form, which also applies emphatically to the activities of the Netherlands Atlantic Education Committee, which I also want to cite. All this despite the aftermath of another year of the corona crisis. A positive aspect is that the reach on social media grew and still continues to grow. In a world that will face even more challenges after February 24, 2022, reaching an ever-growing audience remains an important task.

It is clear that 2022 was a year of change on the geopolitical level. It was also a year of change for the Netherlands Atlantic Association itself. Director Bram Boxhoorn retired and was succeeded by Anna van Zoest. On behalf of the Board of the Netherlands Atlantic Association, I would like to thank Bram for his years of dedicated service. Even in times when NATO received less attention, he kept the social debate alive in the Netherlands, and deserves every credit for this. There have also been changes within the board. As of January 1, 2023 I passed the scepter to Lokke Moerel. With Anna van Zoest and Lokke Moerel, the Netherlands Atlantic Association has acquired worthy helmsmen for a ship that can withstand storms.

REPORT 2022

StudiumGenerale

The StudiumGenerale program of the Netherlands Atlantic Association has been in existence since 2011 and is aimed at young professionals from both private and public sectors. The main objective is to encourage the participants to look at transatlantic relations from different perspectives. A second goal is to expand the network of participants as well as that of the Netherlands Atlantic Association.

The tenth cohort of StudiumGenerale young professionals entered the program in 2021. Their year-long program lasted until summer 2022. The corona measures restricted the program of this cohort considerably. Originally, they had been scheduled to begin the program in March 2020.

The 15 members of the tenth cohort come from Royal Haskoning DHV, Shell Nederland, Thales Nederland, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Netherlands Authority of Consumers & Market, the Ministry of Defense, Cordaid, the Nederlandsche Bank, Philips, Randstad and Diversion. Programs

With the declining impact of COVID-19 on the organization of meetings, in 2022 the Netherlands Atlantic Youth were able to gradually transition from online/hybrid meetings to in-person events. Again this year the Netherlands Atlantic Youth were able to organize a large number of activities, on a broad range of topics.

The outbreak of war in Ukraine featured centrally. On March 7 the Netherlands Atlantic Youth organized a program on this conflict, the Russian threat, and the future of European security. Six months later, on September 27, the Netherlands Atlantic Youth examined the wider impact of the war and the state of international affairs. The annual NATO Night event was held in April: this year in a hybrid format and with Marisa Gerards, the Netherlands Permanent Representative to NATO, as keynote speaker.

In 2022 the Netherlands Atlantic Youth also looked at developments beyond the transatlantic world, including China, the world world of cyber security, the current security situation in Afghanistan and Indonesia's war for independence seen from an international perspective. The US midterm elections also featured: on November 23 Laila Frank discussed the impact the results might have on the 2024 US presidential elections. In addition to the public programs, the Netherlands Atlantic Youth continued the book club established in 2020 and produced more podcast episodes of "The Atlantic View".

Education

The Atlantic Education Committee (AEC) focuses on providing information on transatlantic security issues for teachers and pupils in secondary schools and institutes for teacher training (HBO) by organizing conferences, regional seminars and study trips for teachers from secondary schools and teacher training institutes. Cooperation with teachers' organizations makes it possible to award postgraduate certificates for participation in these educational activities.

The Atlantic Education Committee includes representatives of three teachers' organizations: the Netherlands Association for Teachers of History (VGN), the Netherlands Association for Teachers of Social Studies (NVLM), and the Royal Netherlands Geographical Association (KNAG).

In addition, every year the Atlantic Education Committee organizes a profile paper project for secondary school pupils. Secondary school pupils from throughout the Netherlands can take part in this project and get an opportunity to write a profile paper (PWS) in the field of international peace and security.

Finally, the Committee produces (digital) educational publications. On the website there are lesson modules with extensive information on current developments in transatlantic relations and international security. Pupils can make use of individual and group assignments from the modules.

Programs

After the disruptions caused by Covid in 2021 the annual program of the Atlantic Education Committee could again take place in 2022. Only a few activities in the spring had to be adjusted. The awarding of prizes for the Profile Paper Project was held in the Tweede Kamer, hosted by Salima Belhaj, board member of the Netherlands Atlantic Association and spokesperson for defense of D66. Chair of the jury Nelleke van der Vlistvan Zanten announced the winner, who presented an outstanding research paper on the role and influence of the media in the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The tenth edition of the Profile Paper project began on October 12.

The annual Atlantic Education Conference took place in a special format on Thursday afternoon June 16. The seminar consisted of four lectures, all of them dealing with the geopolitical implications of the Russian invasion of Ukraine on February 24, 2022.

This year the study trip for history, geography and social studies teachers visited the US cities of Boston and New York from October 19 to 26. Participants were struck by the midterm election campaigns taking place during the trip and by the differences between the educational systems of the Netherlands and the US.

The Atlantic Education Committee in cooperation with the Christian University of Applied Sciences Windesheim and NHL Stenden University of Applied Sciences organized on Thursday November 24 the Northern Education Conference in Zwolle. This year's theme was: "The crisis of confidence as a cross-border threat." Over 140 teachers and teachers-intraining participated.

Study visit for journalists

In US presidential election years the Netherlands Atlantic Association organizes week-long study trips to the US for Dutch journalists. Since 2022 was not a presidential election year, no study trip took place.

Chair/Professorship

In 2019 Radboud University Nijmegen appointed prof. dr. Jaap Verheul extraordinary professor of transatlantic relations. This chair was established by the Netherlands Atlantic Association. He will focus in particular on the cultural dimension of modern transatlantic relations between the United States and Europe, with special attention to national imagery and to the shared values that underpin international cooperation.

Dwight D. Eisenhower Thesis Award

The Netherlands Atlantic Association has established a biennial thesis prize in the field of transatlantic relations: the Dwight D. Eisenhower thesis prize. The prize aims to increase scholarly interest and attention for this theme among students. The prize is intended for master's students of history, political science, or a related field, who have written an excellent thesis (in Dutch or English) on a topic in the field of modern transatlantic relations, in particular, the political, economic and/or cultural ties between the United States and Europe or the Netherlands. The prize will be awarded again in 2023.

Atlantic Treaty Association

The Netherlands Atlantic Association is a member of the Atlantic Treaty Association (ATA), the worldwide network organization for all the Atlantic Associations. The ATA organizes two meetings for its members each year. The Netherlands Atlantic Youth also belongs to an international network organization: the Youth Atlantic Treaty Organization (YATA).

The General Assembly of the ATA was held on July 29, 2022. Other ATA activities were limited because ATA and YATA are currently undertaking a "restart."

Media

Atlantisch Perspectief

Atlantisch Perspectief (AP) is the magazine of the Netherlands Atlantic Association. The magazine is published six times a year and contains opinion articles, analyses and columns on current developments in international relations and security policy. This year, for the first time, because of a policy change, the English-language theme issue devoted to NATO was not subsidized by NATO.

From 2011 to 2022, all articles and abstracts of the articles are now available on the website of the Netherlands Atlantic Association. All available articles from *Atlantisch Perspectief* and its predecessors can now also be found in the JSTOR database. That includes Atlantic Tidings and Atlantic News that together go back to 1964.

The editorial board of *Atlantisch Perspectief* consists of the editor, the Editorial Advisory Council and the International Advisory Council.

There was one change to the editorial board in 2022: Bram Boxhoorn was succeeded by Anna van Zoest. At the December 13 meeting Wim Klinkert announced his resignation.

Articles

Atlantisch Perspectief 2022 was once again characterized by a variety of topics. The first issue of 2022 was a theme issue about Germany. The publication of this issue coincided with the start of the war in Ukraine. The editors demonstrated flexibility by delaying printing the issue and having several articles rewritten to include this historical development. The third issue was entirely devoted to the war. Other topics that were also prominently discussed: the tensions in the Indo-Pacific, the Strategic Concept of NATO (unfortunately without subsidy), the midterms, the Marshall Plan, climate and energy, transnational right-wing extremism, etc.

This year again the magazine featured many prominent authors: the special issue on the Strategic Concept once again included a foreword by NATO Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg. Additional copies of this issue were requested by the NATO base Joint Support and Enablement Command (JSEC) in Ulm, Germany. Another positive development is the greater (geographical) diversity of authors and thus the diversity of perspectives, which this year included authors from Portugal, Spain and Turkey.

Opinion Poll

In February 2022, the annual opinion poll on the level of support for NATO in the Netherlands was published. The research was conducted by Kantar Public. The survey again showed strong support for NATO among the Dutch public: three-quarters of the Dutch considered Dutch membership in NATO important for the country's security. The poll also showed that, on the eve of the Russian invasion of Ukraine, half of the Dutch saw Russia as the greatest threat to European security. That was an increase from 2021, when nearly three in ten viewed Russia as the biggest threat.

Website

The Netherlands Atlantic Association website (www.atlantischecommissie.nl) contains information about the organization and its objectives as well as about the many activities of the Netherlands Atlantic Association, the Atlantic Education Committee and Netherlands Atlantic Youth. The homepage features transatlantic news and backgrounds ("must-reads") that are updated twice a week. The visitor is made aware of articles from renowned (international) magazines, think tanks, websites and blogs. Since September 2021, a podcast episode created by the Netherlands Atlantic Youth has also been published monthly.

Many educational publications can be viewed online, and teachers and pupils can use the various lesson modules and web sheets. New teaching modules were developed in 2022. In addition, in 2021 we started digitally archiving all *Atlantisch Perspectief* articles between 1991 and the present.

In 2022, the site was visited 26,654 times by 18,039 users. A decrease of 10.5% and 13.4% respectively compared to 2021. A total of 53,498 pages were viewed, a decrease of 7.4% compared to the previous year. This drop in figures is partly due to the gradual return to in-person events, which meant that fewer activities were organized online and therefore less online traffic was necessary.

Social media

The Netherlands Atlantic Association and Netherlands Atlantic Youth are active on Facebook, Twitter and LinkedIn. In 2021, the LinkedIn pages of the Netherlands Atlantic Association and Netherlands Atlantic Youth were revamped. LinkedIn in particular is showing strong growth, while Facebook is showing less and less interaction. The social media channels are used to increase the brand awareness of both the Netherlands Atlantic Association and Netherlands Atlantic Youth. In addition, through these platforms, our followers are kept informed about the activities that are being organized, useful must-reads, and the articles from *Atlantisch Perspectief* and other publications.

The Netherlands Atlantic Association's Facebook page had 1442 likes on December 31, 2022, that of the Netherlands Atlantic Youth group had 893 and the Netherlands Atlantic Youth page had 1450. In 2022, a message was posted 101 times on the Netherlands Atlantic Association's page, 63 on the Netherlands Atlantic Youth page and 29 on the Netherlands Atlantic Youth group.
