FOREWORD

2023 was a dynamic year in many ways. We saw a continuation of the Russian war in Ukraine, escalating and new conflicts — including in the Middle East — and increasing tensions between the United States and China. Moreover, it became increasingly clear that American attention to Europe cannot be taken for granted. The world is changing before our eyes.

These developments also increased interest in the activities of the Netherlands Atlantic Association Foundation, as a driver of the public debate on transatlantic security. We saw this reflected in well-attended meetings, some of which were organized by the tireless Young Atlantic Association. This year we were able to welcome exceptional speakers again. In addition to Ministers Wopke Hoekstra of Foreign Affairs and Kajsa Ollongren of Defense, a special mention goes to President Maia Sandu of Moldova. She was our guest in September for a discussion about security and democracy on the borders of Europe. In October we organized a successful election debate in De Balie in Amsterdam about geopolitics and defense, with seven spokespersons from political parties.

New technologies are playing an increasingly important role in international politics. For example, the 'tech cold war' between the US and China, which in 2023 revolved around the semiconductor industry, a key sector of the Dutch economy. We also participated in this discussion: as a partner of the 'Summit on Responsible Artificial Intelligence in the Military Domain', RE-AIM 2023, we organized the session 'War Against the Machine?' on ethical issues surrounding artificial intelligence and warfare. In addition, we were the organizer of an event about the new NATO Innovation Fund (NIF) that is being established in the Netherlands. We visited ASML with the participants of the StudiumGenerale program. The concerns felt in Europe and America about the cyber resilience of our critical digital infrastructure and the growing risk of (digital) espionage in knowledge-intensive sectors also rank increasingly high on the agenda of the Netherlands Atlantic Association.

In 2023, we used new instruments to better reach the intended target groups – experts and the interested public, young people and teachers – and to allow them to participate in the discussion. With the editorial staff of *Atlantisch Perspectief* we have taken a new online path that we will explore further in the coming year. This is important to continue to meet the changing needs of our audience. With the podcast series 'De Atlantische Blik' everyone can now listen to the meetings of the Netherlands Atlantic Association.

It is hardly a bold prediction to state that in 2024 - the year of the American presidential elections and the 75th anniversary of the founding of NATO

- the transatlantic bond will again be in the spotlight. I look forward to engaging again this year in a broad conversation on transatlantic affairs, together with all those who want to be involved. I would like to expressly thank the other board members of the Netherlands Atlantic Association, the Atlantic Education Commission, the Young Atlantic Association and the Editorial Board for their continued enthusiasm and commitment in 2023. And, of course, the Association's staff, which once again delivered an impressive program in 2023.

Programs

In 2023, the Young Atlantic Association once again expanded its reach, offering a platform for young people and young professionals interested in transatlantic security issues. During the year, the Young Atlantic Association succeeded again in organizing a multitude of well-attended activities on a wide range of topics.

The Young Atlantic Association, together with the Netherlands Atlantic Association, reflected on the first year of the war in Ukraine and the impact of this conflict on the international order. Together with the Netherlands Atlantic Association, the Young Atlantic Association organized a conversation with Minister of Foreign Affairs Wopke Hoekstra on the eve of the NATO summit in Vilnius. Several board members also participated in international conferences, including the NATO Public Forum, a major conference organized in conjunction with the NATO summit.

The annual flagship event of the Young Atlantic Association, NATO Night, was given a new look this year and will continue under the name 'Atlantic Assembly'. Instead of an evening program, the working group organized a full-day program with various panels, workshops and interviews. In addition, the Netherlands returned to the polls in 2023. On the occasion of the parliamentary elections on November 22, the Young Atlantic Association organized in collaboration with Leiden University the Geopolitical Election Debate, in which the most important international security issues were discussed with various politicians.

In 2023, the Young Atlantic Association also focused on developments beyond the transatlantic area, including China, Russia's growing influence on the African continent and the world of cybersecurity. In addition, the Young Atlantic Association visited NATO headquarters in Brussels, a trip that had not taken place for several years due to COVID-19. Along with its public programs, the Young Atlantic Association once again produced several episodes of the podcast 'De Atlantische Blik'.

Education

The Atlantic Education Committee (AEC) focuses on providing information on transatlantic security issues for teachers and pupils in secondary schools and institutes for teacher training (hbo) by organizing conferences, regional seminars and study trips for teachers from secondary schools and teacher training institutes. Cooperation with teachers' organizations makes it possible to award postgraduate certificates for participation in these educational activities.

The Atlantic Education Committee includes representatives of three teachers' organizations: the Netherlands Association for Teachers of History (VGN), the Netherlands Association for Teachers of Social Studies (NVLM), and the Royal Netherlands Geographical Association (KNAG).

In addition, every year the Atlantic Education Committee organizes a profile paper project for secondary school pupils. Secondary school pupils from throughout the Netherlands can take part in this project and get an opportunity to write a profile paper (PWS) in the field of international peace and security.

Finally, the Committee produces (digital) educational publications. On the website there are lesson modules with extensive information on current developments in transatlantic relations and international security. Pupils can make use of individual and group assignments from the modules.

Study trip for journalists

In US election years the Netherlands Atlantic Association organizes weeklong study trips to the US for Dutch journalists. Since 2023 was not an election year, no study trip took place.

Professorship

In 2019, Radboud University Nijmegen appointed prof. dr. Jaap Verheul extraordinary professor of transatlantic relations. This chair was established by the Netherlands Atlantic Association. Verheul will focus in particular on the cultural dimension of modern transatlantic relations between the United States and Europe, with special attention to national imagery and to the shared values that underpin international cooperation.

Dwight D. Eisenhower Thesis Award

The Netherlands Atlantic Association has established a biennial thesis prize in the field of transatlantic relations: the Dwight D. Eisenhower thesis award. The award aims to increase scholarly interest and attention for this theme among students. The award is intended for master's students of history, political science, or a related field, who have written an excellent thesis (in Dutch or English) on a topic in the field of modern transatlantic relations, in particular, the political, economic and/or cultural ties between the United States and Europe or the Netherlands. The award ceremony took place on January 31, 2023.

Atlantic Treaty Association

The Netherlands Atlantic Association is a member of the Atlantic Treaty Association (ATA), the worldwide network organization for all the Atlantic Associations. The ATA organizes two meetings for its members each year. The Young Atlantic Association also belongs to an international network organization: the Youth Atlantic Treaty Organization (YATA). Articles

At the end of 2023, the editorial team started an 'online first' strategy, whereby articles are first released online and only later appear in print. This way we can respond even better to current events. Articles, interviews and columns are also developed especially for the online channels of the Netherlands Atlantic Association. In 2023, the frequency of Atlantisch Perspectief was reduced from six to four issues, to free up more time and resources for online publications.

The first issue of 2023 looked back on, among other things, the first year of the war in Ukraine. From turning points to the Russian 'world of ideas', to America's role and the risk of 'Ukraine fatigue'. The second issue partly built on this and dealt with arms control in a complex and uncertain world. The third issue was entirely dedicated to the NATO summit in Vilnius. Several NATO authors reflected on the changing alliance and the strategic challenges that lie ahead. The fourth issue was a theme issue on sea power. Admiral Rob Bauer, Chairman of the NATO Military Committee, introduced this issue for us

Opinion Poll

The annual opinion poll on the level of support for NATO in the Netherlands was conducted in February 2023. The research was carried out by Kantar Public (now: *Verian Group*). In addition to questions about NATO and the transatlantic relationship, public opinion about artificial intelligence and warfare was measured.

The research showed that Dutch concerns about the Russian invasion of Ukraine have led to increased support for NATO. The poll showed a significant increase in the number of Dutch citizens who consider NATO membership (very) important for the security of our country (from approximately 75 percent in the period 2019-2022 to 88 percent in 2023). A large group of Dutch citizens also (very) positively support NATO's crucial Article 5, which stipulates that an attack on any ally means an attack on all allies.

Website

The Netherlands Atlantic Association website (www. atlantischecommissie.nl) contains information about the organization and its objectives as well as about the many activities of the Netherlands Atlantic Association, the Atlantic Education Committee and Young Atlantic Association. The homepage features articles, opinion pieces, background

information, and reading-, watching- and listening tips ('must-reads') on current transatlantic events and issues. The visitor is made aware of articles, podcasts and documentaries from renowned (international) magazines, think tanks, websites and blogs. In addition, the Netherlands Atlantic Association in cooperation with the Young Atlantic Association regularly produces the podcast 'De Atlantische Blik'.

Many educational publications can be viewed online, and teachers and pupils can use the various lesson modules and websheets. In addition, in 2021 the Netherlands Atlantic Association started digitally archiving all articles from *Atlantisch Perspectief* between 1991 and the present.

In 2023 the site was visited 35,230 times by 23,444 users. An increase of 32.8% and 29.96% respectively compared to 2022. A total of 64,157 pages were viewed, an increase of 19.92% compared to the previous year. This increase can be attributed in part to the greater frequency of the publication of reading-, listening, and watching tips on social media, which generates traffic on the website.

Social media

The Netherlands Atlantic Association and Young Atlantic Association are active on LinkedIn, Instagram, Twitter and Facebook. LinkedIn in particular is showing strong growth, while Facebook is showing less and less interaction. Since 2023 the Netherlands Atlantic Association is also active on Instagram. The social media channels are used to increase the brand awareness of both the Netherlands Atlantic Association and Young Atlantic Association. In addition, through these platforms, our followers are kept informed about the activities that are being organized, useful must-reads, and the articles from *Atlantisch Perspectief* and other publications.

The LinkedIn-page of the Netherlands Atlantic Association had 1667 followers on December 31, 2023. In 2023, 191 mesages were posted to this page. The LinkedIn-page of the Young Atlantic Association had 1506 followers on December 31, 2023. In 2023 65 messages were posted to this page.

On December 31, 2023 the Netherlands Atlantic Association had 646 followers on X (formerly Twitter) while the Young Atlantic Association had 1307. In 2023 66 tweets were sent by the Netherlands Atlantic Association account and 40 tweets sent by the Young Atlantic Association.

On December 31, 2023 the Instagram-page of the Young Atlantic Association had 1086 followers. In 2023 56 messages were posted to this page. Also in 2023 the Netherlands Atlantic Association created an Instagram page, which had 76 followers on December 31, 2023. In 2023 8 messages were posted to this page.

On December 31, 2023 the Facebook page of the Netherlands Atlantic Association had 1300 'likes', while that of the Young Atlantic Association-group had 870 and the Young Atlantic Association page had 1400. In 2023 messages were posted 6 times on the pages of the Netherlands Atlantic Association, 1 time on the page of the Young Atlantic Association and two times on the page of the Young Atlantic Association-group.

Work with infographics continued in 2023. In the week leading up to the Great Security and Defense Election Debate, graphics were posted online highlighting several transatlantic themes in election manifestos.
